17. Correspondence – relating to The Warren and other matters

The Clerk had received communication from residents of The Warren regarding the damage to the kerb and grassed area. In the first instance the kerb was reported to Kent County Council and has since been replaced.

The Clerk has communicated with Kent Highways to obtain relevant detail as to how much of the verge is maintained by Highways and how much is private.

The Clerk has also communicated with Ashford Borough council and requested a smaller vehicle to undertake waste collection at this location. The response from Ashford Borough Council was that this was not possible at this time.

The Parish Council will consider how to rectify the issue once it has a response from Kent Highways.

18. Local Organisations – Updates

CLP – Cllr Edmed reported that she had attended meetings. The bench in memory of Michael Hinchliffe is now in place and the family are grateful. The CLP raised £153.71 on raffle sales and books at the recent Community Day. The CLP had gained interest from local families who are keen to be involved and the team is now growing. Some committee members have cleared the track at the top of Plain Road and are obtaining quotes for clearing of the pond. There is a local D of E student looking to help locally. There is hope that a boot fair/table top sale could take place on the Warren and will be run alongside Brabourne Baptist Church.

Cllr Harbottle had attended the bench opening which he reported was a success.

PFA – Cllr Edmed attended a meeting recently, it is hoped that people will become involved as opinions are being sought regarding the replacement of play equipment and how it might be funded. Cllr Spokes asked whether income was now being received from visiting teams - this is being investigated going forward in 2023/24.

Village Hall – Cllr Smith reported that the village hall had plenty of bookings and the coronation event had been a success. A member of the public concurred with this success.

Allotments - All seems to be running smoothly at the allotments.

19. Village Caretaker Scheme

It was noted that no difficulties had been experienced of late. It was also noted that the caretaker is now cutting three extra grass triangles close to the Parish boundary.

20. Presentation of the Citizenship Award 2023

The Chairman stated as follows:

"The Citizenship Award is presented by Brabourne Parish Council every year in memory of former Parish Councillor Chris Goodall. All nominees deserve significant credit for all their contributions to our community. This year's award is made jointly to two nominees.

Our first winning nomination describes a gentleman who has worked with the Village Hall for more than 12 years and during that time has organised bookings and financial matters on a daily basis. He was the instigator and organiser of many improvements to the Village Hall, including most recently the installation of a defibrillator, having also contributed physically to the Village Hall's redecoration. He is also involved with the Allotments.

Our second winning nomination describes a lady who was the editor of the monthly Parish Magazine for about 10 years, which allowed everyone to remain informed about community news around the villages. She was the instigator and author of the murder mystery in the Village Hall in November 2022, and also for the Village Variety Show and Supper during the Coronation Weekend in May 2023. In addition, she is involved with the Allotments and also serves as a Brabourne Parish Councillor.

It therefore gives me great pleasure to present this year's Citizenship Award jointly to David and Maggie Smith."

A member of the public asked how the Parish Council could be considered as elected when there had been no vote. The Chairman explained that the Parish Council election

	in May 2023 was uncontested, meaning that no ballot took place because the number of people standing for election did not exceed the number of seats on the Council.
